The Faerie Land: Michael Drayton's Vision of Britain

A groundbreaking exhibition inspired by **Michael Drayton (1563-1631)**'s epic topographical poem of England and Wales, *Poly-Olbion*, an expansive poetic journey through the landscape, history, traditions and customs of early modern England and Wales, imagined county by county.

The Faerie Land represents the rich artistic output of **The Children's Poly-Olbion**, a Heritage Lottery and AHRC funded collaboration between ground-breaking children's arts organization Flash of Splendour, Exeter University & the RGS (with IBG), in which marginalized and disabled children and young adults across the UK engaged with the texts and maps of *Poly-Olbion* and cutting-edge contemporary artists were invited to create new child-focused works based on the poem.

In addition to the children's powerful and accomplished works, the exhibition features a specially commissioned map of England and Wales by cutting-edge artist-cartographer Stephen Walter (stephenwalter.co.uk), a new series of children's illustrations by David Inness and an important collection of 17th century maps and texts, including the RGS copy of *Poly-Olbion*.
